Significant People-Sir Frank Whittle

Strength (Resilience) – Positivity & Compassion

We will be looking at the theme of 'Strength' (Resilience); the children will learn about what it means to persevere at something even when it may seem difficult. Our Focus will be on a significant local person; Sir Frank Whittle. The children will research and explore why he is a significant person to the wider local area. They will also continue to increase their geographical knowledge by exploring a UK map; they will learn about the four countries, their capital cities and any famous landmarks plus lots of other interesting facts!



Key concepts:

Positivity – full of hope and confidence

Compassion – a feeling of wanting to help someone who may be sick, hungry, in trouble etc

Key Knowledge Content:

Our children will be taught:

- The lives of significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national and international achievements: Sir Frank Whittle
- Significant historical events, people and places in their own locality: Coventry Blitz
- To name and locate the four countries and capital cities of the UK
- To use atlases, globes and google earth to identify the UK and its countries
- To identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK and the location of hot/cold areas of the world

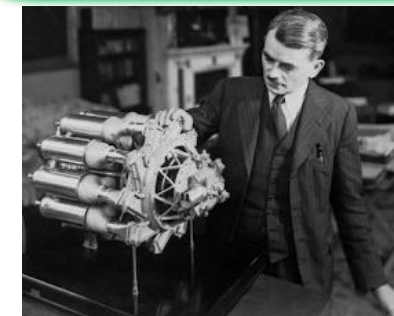

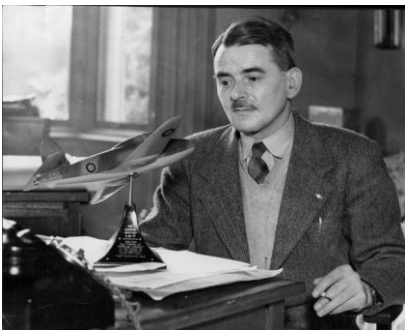

They will learn about Sir Frank Whittle and all his achievements.



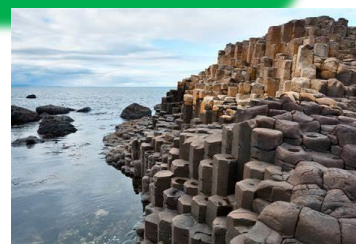
The UK
