Our Focus will be on comparing our village of Bulkington to a seaside town Skegness. They will look at human and physical features of both areas of the UK. They will also look at the history of seaside holidays, looking at how things have changed through time!

They will explore how we need to look after places of beauty such as beaches and how we can all be responsible for ensuring rubbish isn’t left.

Key Knowledge Content:

Our children will be taught:

-Significant historical events, people and places in their own locality.:

Know that children’s lives are different today from a long time ago. e.g holidays on the beach

-To understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of a small area of the United Kingdom – Weston-Super-Mare or Skegness

Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to:

-Key physical features, including: beach, cliff, coast, hill, sea, valley season and weather

-Key human features, including: village, city, factory, farm, house, office and shop.



Key concepts:

Beauty – a feature of objects that are enjoyable to look at.

Sustainability – constant care for our natural world
